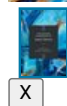

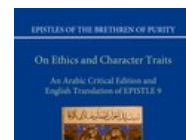

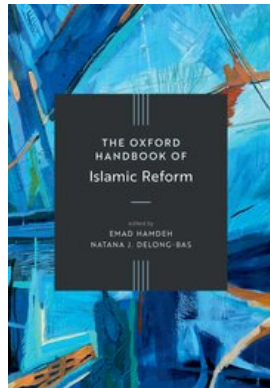

He has published extensively on topics such as Salafism, hadith, Islamic pedagogy, and the Islamic legal schools. Hamdeh is also the author of *Salafism and Traditionalism: Scholarly Authority in Modern Islam* (Cambridge University Press, 2021), which examines the tensions between Salafis and Traditionalists in the 20th century.

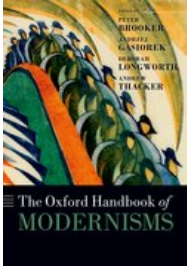

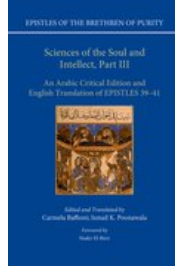

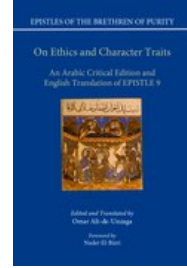
