
Abstract

Given the key role of elections in liberal democratic systems, electoral exercises in conflict regions necessarily involve questions of legitimacy and fairness. that the recent political changes in the state have considerably depoliticized the public sphere and, like historically, prevented people from a credible leadership. The entry of new political parties adds diversity to party politics; however, when understood along with the delimitation exercise, it indicates that the changes would not favor all the parties equally.
